

Dr. Wendy Lee Gramm

Wendy Lee Gramm, called "the Margaret Thatcher of financial regulation" by the Wall Street Journal in 1999, founded the Regulatory Studies Program at the Mercatus Center at George Mason University. She currently is Distinguished Senior Scholar at the Mercatus Center. Wendy served as Chairman of the U.S. Commodity Futures Trading Commission from 1988-1993. She was Administrator for Information and Regulatory Affairs at the Office of Management and Budget from 1985 to 1988, and has also served as the Executive Director of the Presidential Task Force on Regulatory Relief, and Director of the Federal Trade Commission's Bureau of Economics. She started her economics career at Texas A&M University, where she taught in the Department of Economics for over eight years. She holds a B.A. from Wellesley College and a Ph.D. from Northwestern University, both in Economics.
